## 2:1-11: A Textual Survey

- 1. Verses 1-2: The Point of the passage
- 2. Verses 3-4: The Practice expected
- 3. Verse 5: The Pattern for all to see
- Verses 6-11 Explanation of the pattern so that the church gets the "force" of Paul's point (vv 1-2)

## 2:6-11: Textual Analysis

- 1. v 6: form (*morphe*) of God ... equal with God
- 2. v 7a: He emptied Himself [subtraction?]
- 3. v 7b: <u>taking</u> the form (morphe) of a slave ... in the likeness of men
- 4. v 8a in appearance (skema) as a man
- 5. v 8b humbled Himself ... death on a cross
- 6. v 9a God highly exalted Him (v 9b-11a)
- 7. v 11b Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father

## What do we gain from this survey and analysis of Philippians 2:1-11?

- 1. The Incarnation of Christ is a deep theological truth we will never fully understand . . . but it bought our salvation!
- 2. Also . . . the Incarnation of Christ has a clear purpose for each church member.
  - This is the point of Philippians 2:1-2 (!)
- 3. Also . . . to worship the incarnate-dyingrisen Jesus Christ brings glory to the Father – not to worship Jesus . . . ?!?!
