1. The Breakdown of the Paragraph

This paragraph of 5:1-11 is doing two things:

- (a) It is tying the previous chapters together with a single word “Therefore . . . *justified*”
- (b) It is *celebrating the joy* of being justified – This celebration will continue until chapter 8 (Chaps 5-8)

2. The Meaning of the Paragraph

Living as Justified Saints means 3 spiritual blessings

- (1) Peace with God – v 1
- (2) Positioned in Grace – v 2a
- (3) Praise to God – vv 2b-8

The statement of praise with three things to rejoice about (vv 2b-5)

- (a) v 2b – “*our hope*”
- (b) vv 3-4 – “*our tribulations*”
- (c) v 5 – “*our hearts within*”

- vv 6-8 = Demonstration of God’s love

The conclusion of our rejoicing (vv 9-11)

- (d) v 9 – Legal language
- (e) v 10 – Relationship language
- (f) v 11 – Rejoicing in God through our Lord Jesus Christ

3. So, what does this mean for a Justified Saint?

- (1) My *past life* of sin is no longer a legal issue with God
- (2) My *present life* is lived in full confidence by my standing in grace
- (3) My *future life* is guaranteed to be “saved from the wrath of God”
