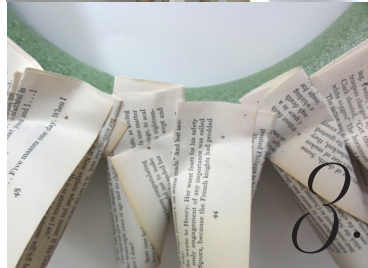


Book Wreaths



1. Attach ribbon or wire as a wreath hanger.
(If you want the paper edges to be colored a bit, spray paint or rub with a stamp pad).

2. Cut paper off the book binding with utility knife

3. Fold pages (short side to short side) into a loose fan or roll, pinching one end. Pin to the back of the wreath. (Alternate rolls and fans).

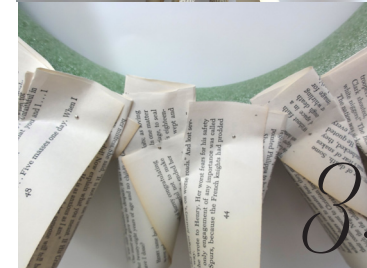
4. Flip wreath to front. Tuck next layer between first row and the wreath form and pin.

5. Once paper is shooting straight out towards you, attach pages by bending them toward the pinned layers. (the pinched end will not touch the pinned rows, but will be bent away from them).

6. Continue pinning rows of folded and rolled pages till you can't see the end of the rolls from the front.

7. Hang with ribbon
